



# Notice To Sani Border users

The Lesotho Revenue Authority (LRA) wishes to inform private shoppers and traders importing goods into Lesotho through an un-designated/non-commercial border post such as Sani Pass, Tele Bridge, Makhaleng Bridge, Peka Bridge and Sephapho's Gate that LRA no longer accept tax invoices as a method of payment for import VAT.

This change comes into effect because the South African Revenue Services (SARS) no longer refund tax invoices from non-commercial borders therefore importers will have to pay the VAT. Private shoppers or traders who may wish to tender their tax invoices as a method of payment for VAT, are advised to make use any of the following commercial borders: Caledonspoort, Maputsoe Bridge, Maseru Bridge, Van Rooyen's Gate and Qacha's Nek Border Gate.
